Little Somerford Parish Council Covid 19 Risk Assessment for the Play Area July 2020

The Play Area is an unsupervised facility where the key responsibility for keeping children safe resides with the parents and carers of all under 18 users of the facility. The Parish Council is unable to provide a cleaning and sanitation service of all equipment on site or hand gel on site. Users are reminded that it is impossible to remove all Covid 19 risk from the Play Area but it is hoped now with easing of the lockdown this facility can be used for the children in the area safely, being respectful of other users. Should the "R" number rise in Wiltshire or there is an outbreak of Covid cases in this or surrounding villages the Parish Council will close the facility and also if it is not used responsibly.
