#### **Public Question Time**

A member of the Speedwatch team was present and gave an update on the current situation. The equipment is now shared with Lyneham and Dauntsey, so will be used by the Little Somerford Team for 2 weeks in every six weeks.

During the first two weeks of August, 881 cars were recorded by the team, with 39 speeders (4.4%). The system for recording and uploading information to the police has changed and now involves more computer work. Those found to be speeding are sent a letter by the police, persistent offenders are visited by the police.

It was requested that the Willowherb growing in the cemetery and allotments be cut down as it is self-seeding onto the allotments.

21/09/6.2 Grass Cutting Contract Specification was agreed. Tenders will be invited to be submitted by early December so that a decision can be made at the January meeting. The contract will start in April 2022 and run for 24 months. To be advertised locally on-line and in Signpost. 21/09/6.3 Cllr Frayling reported that all road signs were in good order, with any issues being reported and actioned over the past 12 months, as they have arisen. Exception is Meadow Lane sign. Action: Clerk 21/09/7.2 **Drains** Flooding at Mill Lane railway bridge, Cllr Cameron reported that Wiltshire Council are writing to the landowner to progress clearing this blocked drain. Drains at St Annes have been jetted again, but it is not known if this has solved the issue of tree root blockage. It is not known if the blocked drain outside Yew Tree Cottage has been cleared. 21/09/8 There were no items brought by Councillors 21/09/9 Clerk's Correspondence which had been circulated to Councillors prior to the meeting. 21/09/9.1 An email from the Environment Agency concerning Illegal Waste had been circulated to Councillors. Property owners are reminded of the laws concerning bonfires and that only garden waste should be burned. If a bonfire of industrial or commercial waste is emitting black smoke it is dealt with under the Clean Air Act 1993 – this includes the burning of such material in your garden. Under section 34 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 it is illegal to dispose of waste that is not from your property - for example from your workplace or from a neighbour. For example, small tradesmen must not burn waste from site at home. The Environment Agency have powers to issue large fines. Fly tipping should be reported to Wiltshire Council and Crimestoppers. This will be promoted on Facebook and the website.
